<b>Material</b>	Co-extruded biaxially orientated polypropylene (BOPP) <b>transparent</b> film, sealable on both sides. Typical applications include rotogravure and flexographic printing, lamination, single web structure, HFFS & VFFS packaging and general over wrapping of products. Suitable for use in applications where barrier property to water vapour, oxygen and aroma are required.
<b>Limitation of Use</b>	BOPP film is suitable for standard ambient flexible packaging applications. Not suitable for microwave, retort, sterilization, irradiation or conventional cooking processes.
<b>Recycled Material Content</b>	No post-consumer recycled content is used.

<b>Compliance with Migration Testing</b>	The materials have been tested in accordance with the requirements of EC 10/2011 and relevant amendments with regards to overall migration limits. Overall migration limits are within the specified limit of 10mg per 1 dm <sup>2</sup> for a cubic packaging containing 1kg of food to a migration of 60mg per kg of food.
<b>Heavy Metals</b>	Our suppliers state that cadmium, chromium (hexavalent), mercury and lead are not intentionally added during product manufacture. Any incidental amounts would not exceed 100 ppm by weight.
<b>BADGE / BFDGE / NOGE</b>	Our suppliers state that epoxy resins used during manufacture are approved and comply with the Union List of Authorised Substances EC 10/2011 and EC 1895/2005 and all relevant amendments.
<b>Allergens</b>	Our suppliers state that the current list of 14 known allergens are not intentionally added during product manufacture.
<b>REACH / SVHC</b>	Our suppliers state that substances are regularly reviewed against the current Candidate List and are not intentionally added during product manufacture.

While we have taken all reasonable steps to verify the accuracy of the information contained in this specification, no warranties are given to this effect and purchasers should determine for themselves whether products are suitable for their own specific use. **Note:** Subject to a 1% tolerance for defective cuts. This version becomes expired when a new issue is generated, the SoC is reviewed annually as a minimum. Where BOPP films are further converted by printing and / or lamination using different printing inks, adhesives, varnishes and other substrates, it is the responsibility of the 3<sup>rd</sup> party converter to determine and satisfy the suitability for food contact regulatory compliance of the converted film; as this conversion process is outside the Company's control, we cannot accept liability in connection with regulatory compliance / suitability of the converted product.

The above stated material is intended for direct food contact; however, it is the responsibility of the end-user to verify its suitability for its intended food application.
